<p>Summary — Dillon Thieneman is a versatile, intelligent, and highly athletic safety with the size, instincts, and skill set to impact a defense across multiple roles. He has experience at free safety, strong safety, and nickel, giving him the flexibility to operate over the top, in coverage, or in the box. Thieneman's game is defined by elite football IQ, sideline-to-sideline range, and disciplined, controlled play, making him a stabilizing presence in the secondary. Thieneman excels in zone coverage, reading route concepts, and maintaining spacing and leverage while keeping eyes on the quarterback. His closing burst and explosiveness allow him to minimize yards after catch, make plays on the ball, and cover ground quickly sideline-to-sideline. In the run game, he diagnoses efficiently and attacks downhill with reliable angles while staying disciplined and flowing through traffic. Physically, Thieneman possesses a well-built frame that can handle multiple roles, though he is better suited to free safety and nickel than as a long-term box safety. His athleticism and instincts allow him to compensate for modest man coverage traits, but he can struggle against shifty slot receivers or sudden changes in direction. He also is not a heavy-hitting safety, and while technically sound, he can be over-aggressive coming downhill at times. Thieneman's experience, football IQ, and versatility make him a high-floor, reliable contributor capable of playing in a variety of schemes. Thieneman is likely to become a multi-year starter in the NFL, particularly in zone-heavy system that allow him to leverage his instincts, range, and football intelligence. Dillon Thieneman is a highly versatile, intelligent, and athletic safety with a rare combination of size, speed, and instincts to play across multiple roles in the secondary. He has experience at free safety, strong safety, and nickel, showcasing the ability to operate over the top, in coverage, or in the box. Thieneman has the tools to be a high end safety in the league for the next several years and is worthy of being drafted in the early teens in the 2026 NFL Draft.</p>											
<p>What Encouraged Me</p> <p>Durability — Thieneman is a durable and dependable presence in the secondary with a well-proportioned frame. He has not missed a game across three seasons at the collegiate level.</p> <p>Positional Versatility — Thieneman possesses a well-balanced, athletic frame with the size and build to hold up across multiple safety roles. He has the structural density and play strength to handle contact in the box while still maintaining the fluidity to operate in space. His overall build supports durability and allows him to consistently play through traffic, engage with blockers, and finish plays without being physically overwhelmed.</p> <p>Football IQ and Instincts — Arguably his most advanced trait, Thieneman has exceptional processing speed and situational awareness. He reads route concepts, quarterback eyes, and offensive keys quickly, rarely leaving himself out of position. He maintains discipline while flowing to the ball and reacts instantly to misdirection or motion.</p> <p>Athleticism — A top-tier athlete for his position, Thieneman boasts explosive burst, closing speed, and agility that allow him to impact the catch point, limit YAC, and cover ground sideline-to-sideline. His combine testing confirmed the athleticism seen on tape, demonstrating the rare combination of speed, explosiveness, and fluidity needed to thrive in multiple safety roles.</p> <p>Coverage — Thieneman is an elite zone defender with outstanding spatial awareness and the ability to play over the top and put a roof on the defense. He recognizes routes quickly, maintains disciplined eyes on the quarterback, and reads timing concepts with precision. His awareness allows him to break on the ball efficiently and minimize YAC opportunities for opponents.</p> <p>Run Defense — Thieneman shows the ability to diagnose run schemes quickly and attack downhill with excellent pursuit angles. He can engage blocks and locate the ball carrier with reliable technique, flowing to the football with consistency. His tackling is secure and controlled, helping limit forward progress.</p> <p>Tackling — Generally a technically sound and controlled tackler in space, regularly breaking down and coming to balance leading into contact. Consistently ended up as a leading tackler in multiple roles while playing in two different programs.</p> <p>Production and Experience — Thieneman has significant collegiate experience across multiple seasons in different defensive schemes, showing he can adjust to varying responsibilities while producing consistently. His versatility and reliability allow him to contribute in multiple packages and roles at the next level.</p>					<p>Areas for Growth or Concern</p> <p>Lacks Elite Size — While he is well-built, his frame projects best as a free safety or nickel rather than a long-term box safety. He lacks the elite play strength to dominate physically against lead blockers consistently.</p> <p>Man Coverage Limitations — Though effective in zone, Thieneman is not a top man coverage defender. Quick, shifty slot receivers can create separation due to his average change-of-direction ability and some tightness in mirroring abrupt movements.</p> <p>Run Defense — He can sometimes come downhill too aggressively, compromising balance and leaving gaps in pursuit angles. On the perimeter, his block deconstruction against lead blockers is an area that can continue to improve.</p> <p>Tackling — Thieneman is a reliable tackler but not an enforcer type; he does not deliver heavy, punishing hits, which can limit his physical impact in the box. He secures tackles, wraps ball carriers and earns the tackle, but his true stopping power is modest.</p>
